In July 2020, our two Safe Landing crisis shelters merged into one co-ed facility, providing residential and non-residential care to boys and girls, ages 11-17. It has been a wonderful transition for both staff and youth, and the shelter looks amazing thanks to our hardworking House Manager, Patsy, many other staff members, and of course, our kind donors who have made all of this possible. We are so thankful for your support and are grateful for the opportunity to serve so many kids under one roof! The figures below reflect the successes Safe Landing has experienced this past year in helping youth blossom into the best versions of themselves. We wanted to share this happy news with you! Safe Landing successes include:

- Served 151 boys, and 133 girls through residential and non-residential services
- ❖ 93% of youth exited into a positive placement
- ❖ 93% of youth indicated positive satisfaction rating of the program and 95% of parents reported positive satisfaction rating through exit surveys
- ❖ 723 family and individual counseling sessions were provided to youth in residential care, 45 sessions were provided to non-residential youth
